In early January, 100 years ago; 19 retrievers competed in the *fifth IGL Retriever Championship Stake* held over the Wytham Abbey shooting of Charles Butter, near Oxford.

*Considered the best competition since the institution of field trials for retrievers,* it was won by Archibald Butter's Labrador FTCh Patron of Faskally, a son of the 1911 Retriever Champion FTCh Peter of Faskally.

The latter remains one of the most influential sires in Labrador history: no fewer than 10 of his progeny ran in the Championship between 1912 and 1920, claiming amongst them 6 awards.
